

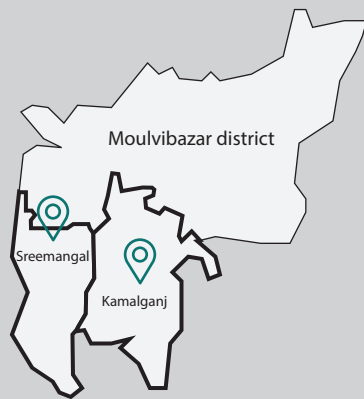


# Accessing Learning Opportunities to the Young, Adolescents and Livelihood Options for Women (ALOY-ALLOW)

Funded by ChildFund Korea, the five-year project (2019-2024) aims to contribute to ensuring the rights to education and dignity of life of children following an integrated development program approach.

- Seasonal floods every year including flash floods
